Programs like Apex, TopStep, and Take Profit Trader allow you to trade simulated or live markets with firm capital after passing a performance evaluation. In return, you split your profits with the firm — usually keeping 80–90% while the firm takes a small cut.

The catch? Most traders fail these evaluations. Not because they're "bad," but because they approach the game without structure.

Funded programs test more than your strategy — they test your behavior, discipline, and risk control.

This book was created with those realities in mind — to give you a structure that helps you pass, stay funded, and actually get paid.

# Funding Program Traps: A Behavioral Lens

Before we dive into the traps, take a moment to center yourself.

This is not a critique of your past mistakes—it's a blueprint for identifying behavioral patterns that hold you back and rewiring your trading approach for success. If you've struggled with funded accounts before, you're not alone. If you're starting fresh, even better — now you can skip the pain most traders experience.

Let's begin with the first trap — and why it's the most common downfall.

## Trap # 1: The Oversizing Trap

### Trap #1: Oversizing — The Funded Trader's Illusion

So why do we fall into the oversizing trap?

Because every funded program dangles the same promise:

“You can trade up to 6, 8, even 10 contracts.”

Sounds great, right?

That's exactly the problem.

The moment traders see those numbers, their brain jumps to math like:

“10 contracts × 10 points = \$5,000. Just need a few of those to hit payout.”

What starts as ambition turns into pressure.

And that pressure leads to emotional, oversized trades.

#### Here's the truth:

**Size doesn't accelerate success — it accelerates destruction.**

Especially when you haven't built the mental discipline and structure to manage it.

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### Why Oversizing Feels Logical... But Isn't

You're not dumb. You're just doing the math.

But the problem isn't logic — it's **timing**.

In evaluations and PAs:

- You don't control the drawdown trail
- One bad day erases five good ones
- You're trying to be funded **and** prove consistency

There's no room for "big bet" thinking here.  
What looks like a shortcut is usually the detour to blowing up.

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### **Solution: Earn the Right to Size Up**

In this playbook, you'll see this again and again:

**You don't start with size — you earn it.**

Size is a reward for:

- Following your process
- Hitting consistency goals
- Building risk buffer over time

Instead of maxing out your contract count from day one, try this approach:

- Start with 1–2 MES or 1 ES
- Trade for \$300–\$500 per session
- Only increase size **after you've earned +\$1,500 buffer**

Oversizing is not the tool — it's the test.  
Pass it by staying small until your plan proves itself.

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## Trap # 2: The Scalping Spiral

### **Trap #2: The Scalping Spiral — When "Just One More" Becomes Your Downfall**

On June 14, a funded trader in our group logged a 3-tick gain... then chased three more tiny moves, turning +\$150 into -\$300. Here's why that "just one more" mindset feels safe—and why it's anything but.

You tell yourself you're just taking a quick scalp. A small move. A clean setup.

Then you take another... and another.

Before you know it, your session is a blur of button clicks, small wins, fast losses, and creeping frustration.

Welcome to the scalping spiral — where funded traders burn out chasing **every move**, instead of waiting for **the right move**.

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## Why It Happens

Two reasons:

1. **You want to be active** — it feels like “doing something”
2. **You feel in control when you’re trading small size repeatedly**

Ironically, that false control leads to the **exact behavior that causes failure** in funded trading:

- Overtrading
- Sloppy entries
- No risk-reward structure
- Violating the 30% consistency rule

And here’s the kicker:

You may win a lot... but you’ll rarely get paid.

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## Scalping in a Funded World = Death by a Thousand Cuts

Evaluation and PA accounts aren’t built for 30 tiny trades a day.

They reward:

- One or two clean setups
- Clear risk-reward execution
- Discipline over dopamine

Scalping doesn’t just fatigue your account — it fatigues **your brain**, your decision-making, and your emotional capital.

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## Solution: Trade Like You’re Already Getting Paid

Start every session with this mindset:

“If I was already funded and getting payouts, would I take this trade?”

Scalping thrives on “maybe.”

Funded consistency thrives on “**absolutely yes.**”

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## Trap #3: The Redemption Trade

### Trap #3: The Redemption Trade — Revenge in Disguise

You took a loss.

You didn't follow your stop, or maybe the market faked you out.

You sit there staring at the screen, thinking:

"I know this trade can come back. I just need one win to erase that hit."

"Just one more trade and I'll be green for the day."

"I need to redeem myself."

Sound familiar?

That's not a strategy — that's a **trap**.

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### The Redemption Trade Is Just Revenge Dressed in Logic

You think you're being rational.

You say things like:

- "This is actually a valid setup..."
- "The context supports the trade..."
- "Risk is small, reward is big..."

But deep down, the trade is coming from **emotion, not edge**.

You're reacting to pain, not reading the market.

And that's where most funded traders spiral:

- You overstay losing trades
  - You average down emotionally
  - You try to "win back control" instead of resetting
- 

### Redemption Leads to Spiral

In a normal job, you can make a mistake and try again tomorrow.

In trading, one forced trade after a loss can derail **your whole evaluation**.

One bad redemption trade = consistency violation  
One size-up = drawdown breach  
One "just this once" = reset fee

You didn't just lose a trade — you lost momentum, clarity, and control.

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### **Solution: Pause, Don't Push**

Before you take that redemption trade, ask:

"Would I still take this setup if I was green today?"

If the answer is no — **don't trade it.**

Instead:

- Log the loss
- Walk away for 10–15 minutes
- Review your structure
- Come back as if it's a new session

Redemption never comes from the next trade.  
It comes from the next **right trade.**

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## Trap #4: The Afternoon Chase

### **Trap #4: The Afternoon Chase — Forcing Trades After the Edge Is Gone**

It's 1:00 PM. You've been watching the charts all day.  
You had a small green morning... or maybe you're slightly red.  
You're bored. Twitchy. Looking for something to "happen."

Then you think:

"There might be one more move left..."

"This looks like it's coiling again..."

"I missed the morning — maybe I can make it up."

So, you take the trade.

And that's where the afternoon chase begins.

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## Why the Afternoon Pull Is So Dangerous

Afternoons feel deceptively calm.

Price slows. Movement compresses.

It gives you just enough activity to believe the next breakout is coming.

But the truth?

Afternoons are **low-probability, high-risk traps** — especially for funded traders.

- Volume dries up
- Trend context gets muddy
- Emotional fatigue is high
- You're more likely to second-guess stops or chase confirmation late

You don't see the market clearly anymore — you see what you *want* to see.

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## Funded Traders Can't Afford Afternoon Mistakes

Every afternoon chase puts you at risk of:

- Breaking the 30% payout consistency rule
- Losing your daily buffer
- Triggering a reset in an otherwise decent week
- Digging a hole that wasn't necessary

It's not that trades don't happen in the afternoon — they do.

But if you're in a funded environment without clarity, tight risk control, and high confidence in your read — you're gambling.

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## Solution: Set a Daily Cutoff Rule

This is one of the **single best risk guardrails** I use:

"I only trade from 8:30 AM to 11:00 AM — and only if the structure is clear."

After that, I shift to **review mode, journaling, or replay**.

Why?

Because in funded trading, your job is **to protect the edge**, not to force trades into silence.

Here's the truth:

Most funded traders don't lose in the morning.  
They lose by giving the market a second chance in the afternoon — and it doesn't return the favor.

## Trap #5: Breaking The Consistency Rule

### Trap #5: Breaking the Consistency Rule — The Quiet Killer of Payouts

You had your best day ever.

+15 points on ES.

A perfect breakout.

You nailed it — one trade, \$2,000 in profit. You're flying.

Then payout day comes...

And your request is denied.

Why?

Because that monster day was **too good**.

It violated the **30% Consistency Rule** most prop firms like Apex enforce.

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### What Is the Consistency Rule?

In most funded accounts, especially Apex:

- You're allowed a payout only if no single day accounts for **more than 30%** of your total profit since your last withdrawal.

So, if your total profit for the cycle is \$3,000...

- No one day should be over \$900
- That massive \$2,000 day? It just voided your payout window

And yes — this rule resets **after every payout**.

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### Why This Rule Wrecks Great Traders

It punishes front-loaded performance.

You do well early... and then either have to:

- Sit out for days, or
- Take “filler trades” to water down the average

That’s where most traders spiral:

- They take low-quality trades just to balance the curve
- They re-risk good performance just to meet policy

In trying to “comply,” they end up breaking discipline.  
And often, the account.

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### **Solution: Spread Wins Intentionally**

You don’t have to suppress your winners.  
But you do need a **payout-smart strategy**.

Here’s what I recommend:

1. **After a big day, scale down for 2–3 days**  
Take partial setups or let the market come to you
2. **Balance your sessions:**  
3–5 green days with \$300–\$600 is better than one \$2K spike
3. **Use trade caps:**  
Stop trading after \$800–\$900 profit to protect payout eligibility
4. **Track your curve:**  
Keep a running % tracker to know when you’re nearing the limit

Remember, the goal isn’t to max out P&L every day — it’s to **get paid** consistently, then grow from there.

## Beating the Home Run Mindset

**You don’t need one big trade.**

You need 100 small ones done right.

Every trader has felt it — the rush of a monster trade that goes 4R, 5R, 10R. The high is addictive. The ego kicks in. “If I can do this once, I can do it again.”

That’s where the damage begins.

### **The Problem with the Home Run Mindset**

In funded programs, this mindset is **especially dangerous**.  
Why?

- **It triggers over-positioning.** (“Just size up one time...”)
- **It invites poor trade selection.** (“It’s not perfect, but the reward is huge...”)
- **It increases emotional attachment.** (You don’t manage the trade — you marry it.)
- **It leads to inconsistency.** (One big win. Two red days trying to do it again.)

And worst of all — **it makes you think you’re done.**

“I hit my \$1,000 day. I’ll just withdraw now...”

But in Apex, Topstep, or any other funded program, the game isn’t one day. It’s **how you spread performance across time.**

### **The Real Game: Stay in the Game**

Most traders blow up because they try to **end the game early.**

They try to pass the evaluation in 4 days.

They try to hit a \$2,000 profit day and stop trading.

They don’t understand the structure.

In reality:

- **You pass evaluations by stringing together clean \$300–\$500 days.**
- **You hit payouts by spreading your profits across 5–10 sessions.**
- **You stay funded by keeping your losses small, not chasing big wins.**

If you flip your mindset from *“finish fast”* to *“survive with strength”* — everything changes.

### **Why Small Wins Matter More Than Big Ones**

Big trades feel good.

Small trades **build good.**

Consistent wins improve:

- **Confidence** — you’re proving your edge
- **Clarity** — you stop chasing
- **Emotional balance** — you avoid P&L spikes
- **Quality of life** — fewer regrets, more structure

This is a *lifestyle shift*, not just a trading one.

And it starts when you stop hunting home runs — and start playing the long game.

“The trader who survives longest wins the most.”

# The Funded Formula 5: Your Framework For Funded Success

## The Funded Formula 5 – Trade Less, Earn More, Stay Funded

Let's be real...

Most traders come into a funded program thinking:

"If I just hit the profit target fast, I'm good."

But what happens next?

They overtrade.

They violate rules.

They blow up the Performance Account **after** passing evaluation.

That's why this framework exists.

The **Funded Formula 5** is my personal operating system to help you:

- Get funded
- Stay funded
- Get paid consistently
- Avoid emotional spirals
- Grow with structure, not stress

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### The 5 Pillars of the Formula

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#### 1. Daily Cap Plan:

##### 1. Daily Cap Plan (Example: 50K Funded Account)

**Start with 2–4 MES per trade | \$250 daily loss cap | \$500 daily profit goal**

Let's anchor this to a real-world scenario:

Assume you're trading a \$50K funded account with a \$3,000 profit target and a \$2,500 trailing drawdown.

That means you have very little margin for error — just one overextended day can knock you out.

So, we simplify:

- **Max loss/day:** \$250
- **Target/day:** \$500
- **Max contracts:** 2–4 MES only to start
- **ES usage:** Only after proving structure discipline and gaining drawdown buffer — especially on trend days

Why this matters:

- This structure allows for **6–10 trading days** of learning or slow growth without breaching risk
- Keeps you focused on **quality over quantity**
- Reduces the temptation to “win it all back” on a down day

And if you’re trading a bigger account like 100K or 150K?  
Adjust proportionally — but keep the **discipline ratio the same**.

The funded game doesn’t reward speed.  
It rewards structure and staying in the game long enough to scale.

## 2. Session Cutoff:

**Only trade from 8:30–11:00 AM ET**

Why it matters:  
Morning sessions are structured, clean, and high-volume.  
Afternoons are emotional traps with lower edge.  
Set a timer. Walk away when the edge fades.

## 3. Setup Filter:

**Only A+ setups with structure + checklist confirmed**

Why it matters:  
No more “meh, it looks good.”  
You need conviction, not curiosity.  
Rate your trades before taking them.

*“Would I take this trade 100 times with size?” If not, skip it.*

## 4. Sizing Ladder:

**Start with MES (or 1 ES), only size up after \$1,500 buffer**

Why it matters:

Every program gives you access to size.

Your job is to **earn the right** to use it.

Small size = clarity.

Big size too soon = broken consistency.

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## 5. Payout Smart:

**Stop trading after \$800–\$1,000 profit in a session**

**Balance daily profits to meet the 30% consistency rule**

Why it matters:

Payouts aren't just about profits — they're about pacing.

Get paid more often by managing your curve intentionally.

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## Your Job Is Not to Trade More — It's to Trade Better

This framework isn't about capping your growth.

It's about protecting it.

If you're serious about funding success, this system will help you:

- Reduce resets
- Build payout eligibility
- Stay in control during red days
- Know exactly when to step on the gas

## Your Risk Guardrails

### Why You Need Guardrails — Even If You “Know Your Risk”

Most traders think discipline is a mindset.

It's not.

It's a **system**.

Without a system of checks — emotional, behavioral, and structural — you'll eventually break discipline. Not because you're weak... but because **you're human**.

That's why we need guardrails.

They're the **"if-then" rules** you set **before** the session starts — not in the heat of execution.

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### **Core Guardrails for Funded Traders**

These rules are the invisible walls that keep you from blowing up or spiraling after one bad trade:

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#### **1. Red Zone Rule: -\$250/day max**

Once you hit -\$250 on the day — STOP.

No revenge trades. No "just one more" ES scalp.  
Shut it down, reset, and journal.

This one rule alone has saved my accounts more times than I can count.

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#### **2. Yellow Zone Rule: -\$150 on the day? Downsize.**

If you're already down \$150, reduce size to **1 MES** or go into **"observation mode"**.

The worst trades happen when you're trying to make back what's already gone.

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#### **3. Green Zone Rule: +\$500? Lock the gain.**

Once you hit your target — **close the platform**.

Don't scalp away a great day. You can always review setups in replay.

Remember: the only goal is to survive the evaluation, protect the PA, and get paid.

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#### **4. Session Time Rule: Stop at 11:00 AM ET**

The longer you trade, the more your edge decays.

Most of your best setups come in the first 60–90 minutes of the session.  
Afternoon trading = fatigue-based errors.

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## 5. Confidence Rule: 2 losses in a row = STOP

Not because the market's done — but because **you might be**.


Two back-to-back losses is a **mental tilt trigger**.


Don't trade through it — step back, breathe, and review.


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### Bonus: Create Your Own Guardrail Card

Print this. Keep it on your desk or screen.

 Green Zone = Stay sharp

 Yellow Zone = Downsize

 Red Zone = Shut down

Every funded trader should have a **visual map** of their behavioral triggers.

This isn't about limiting yourself.

It's about creating the space where **your best trades can show up — without sabotage**.

# RED ZONE

<-\$400 / >+\$600

# YELLOW ZONE

-\$300 / +\$400

# GREEN ZONE

-\$250 / +\$300

## The Intraday Trailing Drawdown Trap

One of the biggest hidden traps in many funded trading programs is the **intraday trailing drawdown** — especially for accounts that calculate drawdowns based on **unrealized equity**, not just closed profits.

Here's what most traders don't realize:

- You can have a winning trade... and still **fail the evaluation** if you let it run too far without locking in profit.
- That's because **the peak equity on your trade becomes your new trailing benchmark**.

Imagine this: You go long on the ES with a target of +10 points. The trade runs beautifully — up +15 points. But you don't take profit. It pulls back sharply, and you exit at +5.

What happens? Your **trailing drawdown locks at +15 points**, and your **net result of +5 gets measured against that peak**. Even though it's a green trade, you've now **cut into your cushion** or potentially violated the trailing threshold.

**In intraday trailing accounts:**

"Letting your winners run" can be a **liability**, not a strategy.

### **Solution: Use ATM Strategies in NinjaTrader**

If you're trading through NinjaTrader, you can use **ATM (Advanced Trade Management) strategies** to protect yourself:

- Set automatic **profit targets** (e.g., +10 pts)
- Add **auto break-even stops** after a certain move in your favor
- Use **trailing stops** to follow strong momentum without giving it all back

The goal here isn't to micromanage — it's to **lock in equity before your account equity peaks unrealistically high**.

This is especially important in evaluations like Apex's 50K account, where a **\$2,500 trailing drawdown** is enforced **on a tick-by-tick basis**.

### **Tip:**

Always know: *Is your drawdown calculated on realized or unrealized profit?*

If it includes unrealized P&L — structure your exits. Don't gamble with a winner that could cost your account.

# Using NinjaTrader ATM Strategies to Protect Your Payout Potential

In funded trading programs, managing trailing drawdowns and protecting realized gains is just as important as spotting A+ setups. Many traders get caught up in letting winners “run” — only to watch those profits evaporate due to intraday trailing rules.

That’s where **NinjaTrader’s ATM (Advanced Trade Management) strategies** come in.

These strategies aren't just convenience tools — they’re critical **risk guardrails**. Properly configured, they:

- Secure partial profits before a trade turns against you
- Automatically move stops to break-even after key milestones
- Keep your **drawdown buffer** safe (especially in Apex and other firms that calculate it intraday)
- Allow hands-free management during fast-moving setups

## What is an ATM Strategy?

An **ATM Strategy** in NinjaTrader allows you to:

- Enter trades via your manual or automated signals
- Let NinjaTrader manage the exits — including stop loss, profit targets, and trailing logic
- Configure templates for different market conditions (e.g. volatile vs calm)

This creates a **hybrid model**: manual discretion meets automated discipline.

“Your entry is up to you. Your risk control? Let the ATM handle it.”

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## Why This Matters for Funded Traders

With a **trailing drawdown**, unrealized gains **do count** — and if you don’t lock them in, your account may show a peak balance that’s used against you later.

Letting a +15-point ES trade turn into break-even doesn’t just hurt emotionally — it can disqualify you from payouts.

ATM strategies **force discipline**:

- Secure your edge
  - Avoid “round-tripping” profits
  - Protect your evaluation or PA account
- 

 **Pro Tip: Create Multiple Templates**

Label your templates clearly (Calm\_Market, Trend\_Push, Scalp\_Quick) so you can adapt with just one click — no panic during fast markets.

Funded traders should create and backtest at least 3 ATM templates — volatile, choppy, and trending.

Because here, your job isn't to trade.

It's to manage risk — and **only take trades that are worth your limited firepower.**

## The Risk-Reward Equation That Actually Works

Trader	Win Rate	Risk: Reward	Weekly Result
Scalper	60%	1:1	Breakeven
Funded Pro	60%	1:2	+\$1,000+

Now flip it.

Even if the funded pro **loses more than they win**, they can still finish green:

- 2 Wins × \$500 = +\$1,000
- 3 Losses × -\$250 = -\$750
- **Net: +\$250** — and still payout eligible

This is the core of **asymmetric trading**:

You risk less than you stand to gain.

---

## Why Most Traders Ignore This (And Lose)

Because psychologically, losses feel worse than gains.

So traders:

- Cut winners too early

- Let losers breathe
- Trade wide and sloppy, without a defined stop

They want to *feel* right — instead of managing risk.

But funded traders don't chase wins.

They chase **process consistency** and **profit stability**.

### **Your Goal: 1:2 Risk: Reward on Every A+ Setup**

Here's your baseline formula for funded consistency:

- **Risk:** \$250 (or smaller)
- **Reward target:** \$500
- **Trade frequency:** 1–3 per day
- **Win rate required:** 40–50%
- **Target outcome:** \$1,000–\$2,000/week

And the bonus?

This fits perfectly within most programs' **30% consistency** and **drawdown** rules.

# 1–3 Trades A Day

## Why Frequency Kills Funded Accounts

---

You wake up, prep your watchlist, and take your first trade.

Win or lose — you feel good. You're "in the game."

Then you take another.

And another.

And before you know it, your solid plan has turned into **15 MES trades, 6 reversals, 4 scalps, and a red day.**

This is the slippery slope of **over-frequency** — and it's one of the biggest silent killers in funded trading.

---

## Why Most Traders Overtrade (Even When They Swear They Won't)

Because funded trading creates **two illusions**:

1. *"The more trades I take, the faster I'll hit the target."*
2. *"I'll just take a few small scalps to smooth out the curve."*

But that's **not how these accounts are designed.**

They're built to reward:

- Controlled execution
- Tight risk
- Clean setups
- Rule adherence

Not volume.

Not dopamine.

Not "one more quick win."

---

## The Mental Trap Behind Overtrading

Overtrading isn't just about greed — it's about **loss of clarity.**

The more trades you take:

- The more noise you introduce

### **Pro Tip: Rate Your Setup Before You Take It**

Before you click "Buy," ask:

"Is this an A+ setup or a boredom trade?"

If it's not A+ → Pass.

If it's clean → Trade it like it's your only one today.

### **Default Daily Plan:**

- 1 A+ Setup → Execute
- 2nd Trade → Only on reconfirmed setup
- 3rd Trade → Only on trend days with clear reclaim or continuation

## The Power Of No-Trade Days

### **Why Flat Is Sometimes the Best Position**

---

Most traders think every trading day must end with action.

They tell themselves:

“There has to be something worth trading today.”

“I don't want to miss out.”

“Let me just try one setup...”

And that's how accounts get chipped away — not in big chunks, but in slow, consistent slippage caused by **forcing trades when none are required.**

But here's the truth:

**No-trade days are a sign of strength — not hesitation.**

They protect your edge.

They preserve your capital.

### **Why Most Traders Fear Being Flat**

Because “flat” feels like failure.

Every trader thinks their meltdown is unique — until they see just how common these patterns are. Below are real stories from funded traders across the internet. Different accounts. 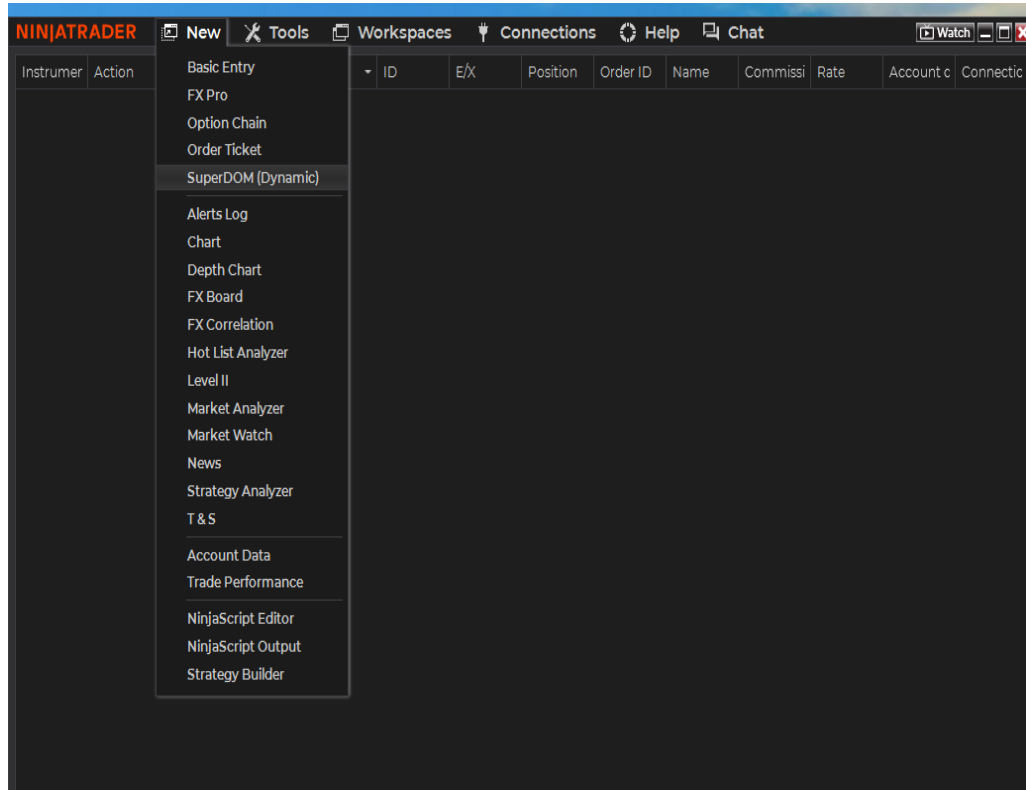

## How to Set It Up (Step-by-Step)

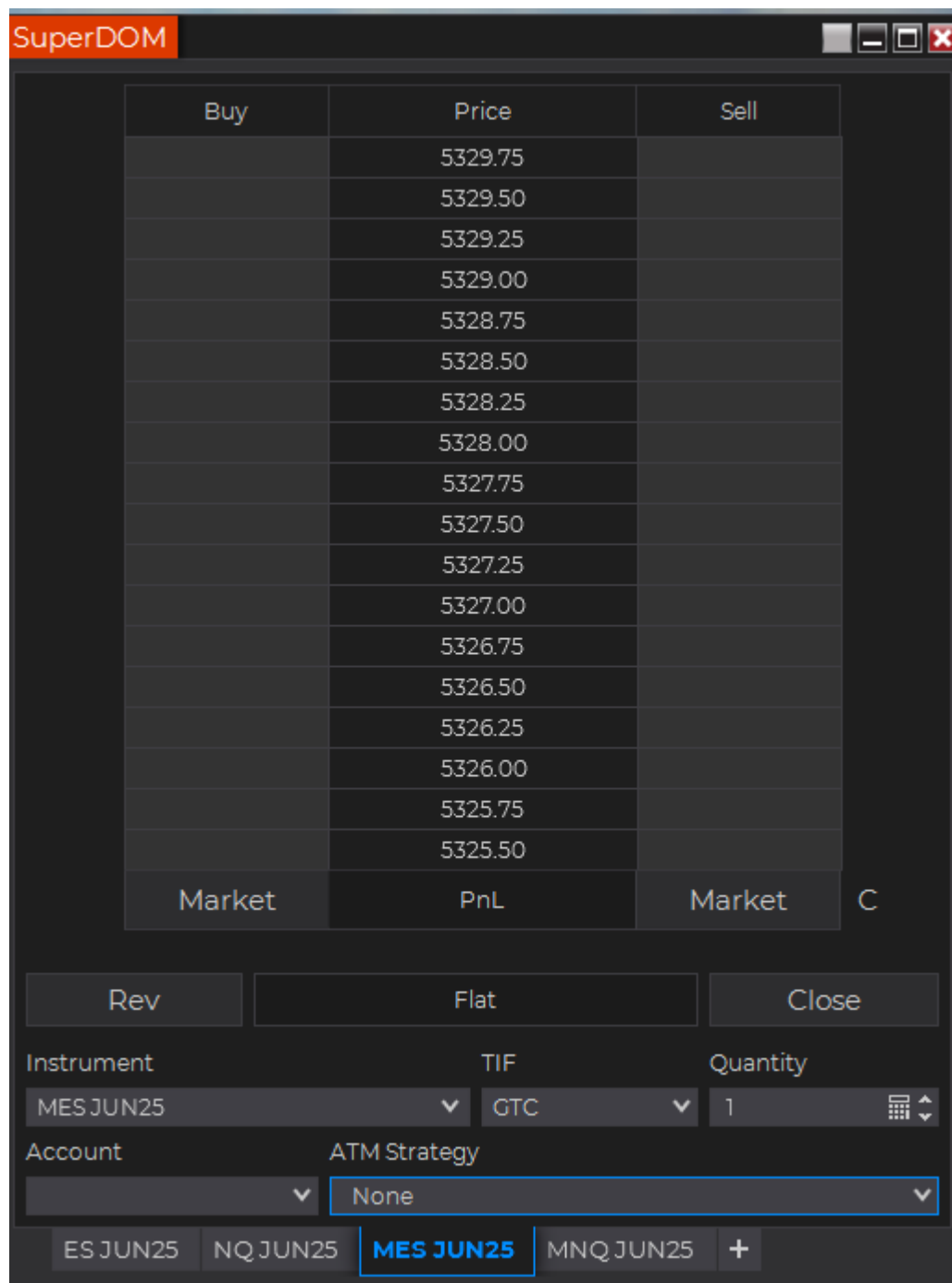
### 1. Open SuperDOM or Chart Trader

- Go to *New > SuperDOM* (or use Chart Trader from a chart)

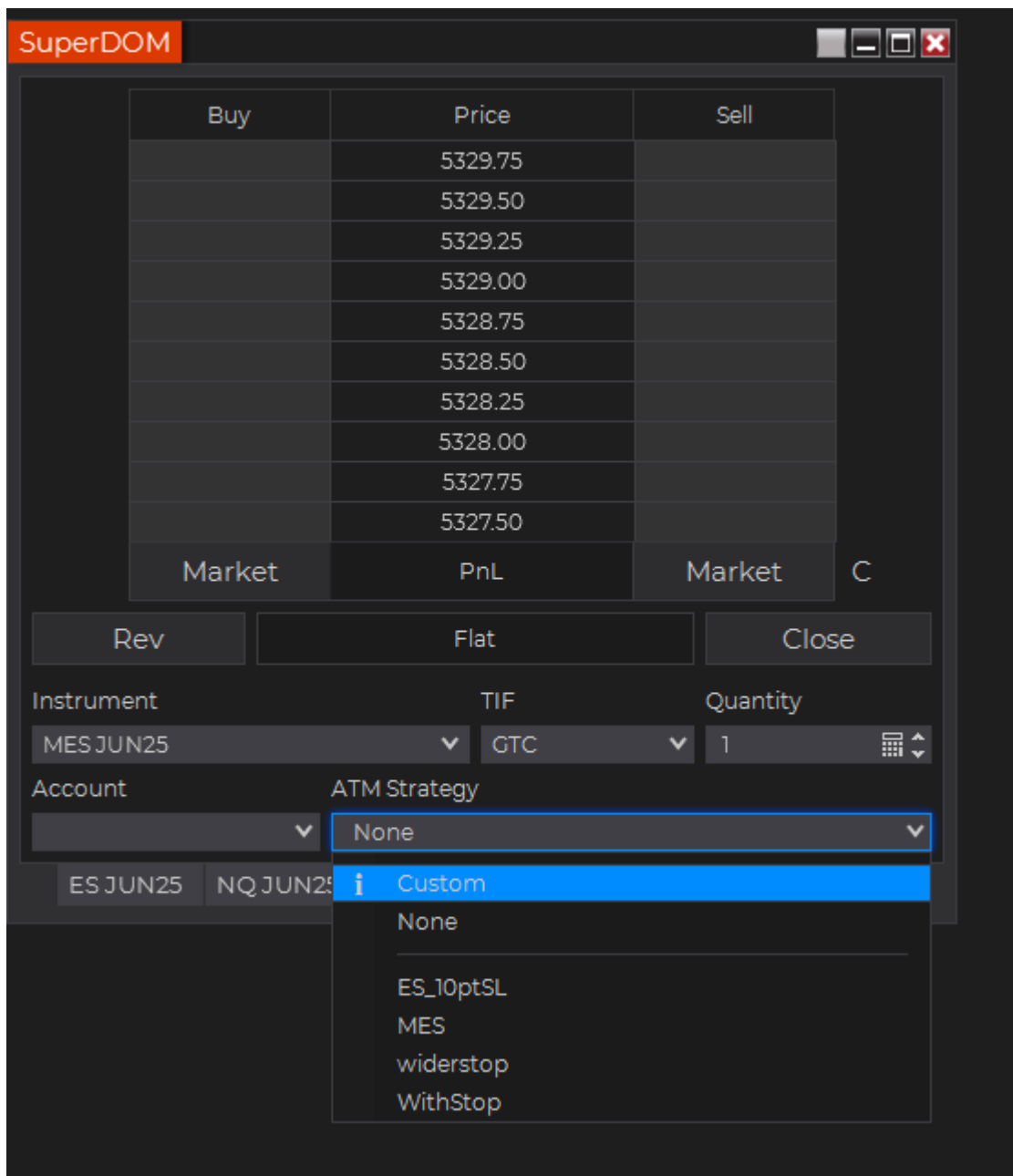


### 2. Look for the ATM Strategy Panel

- Bottom of the SuperDOM window

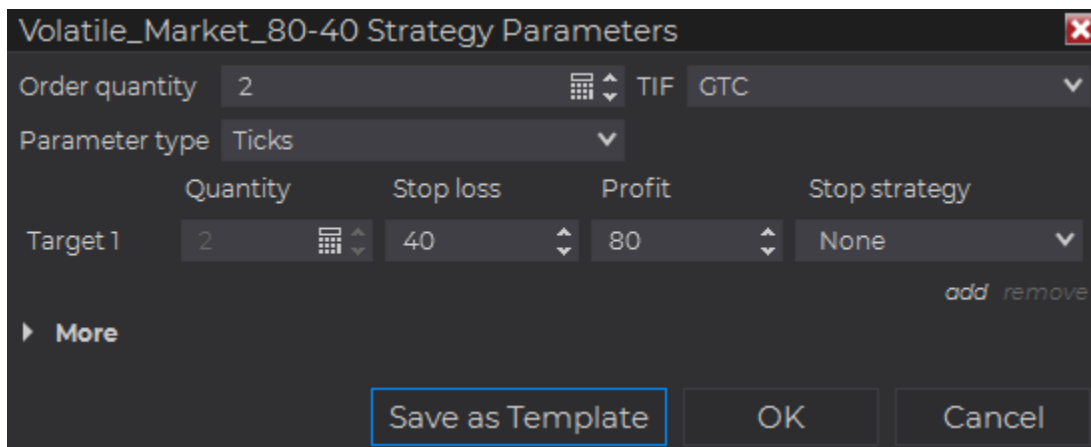


3. Click on "Custom" to Create a New Template  
You'll see a configuration screen like this:



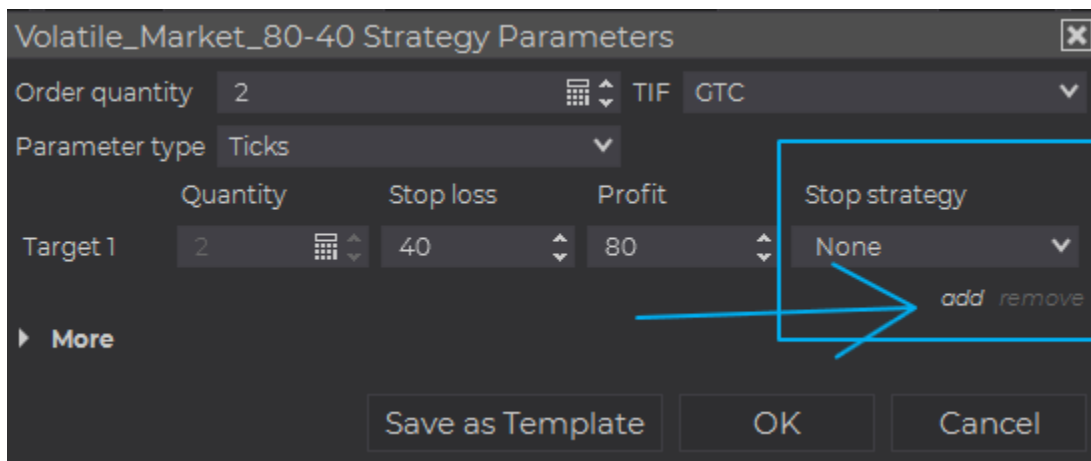
### ⚙️ Example 1: Volatile Market ATM Strategy

- **Strategy Name:** Volatile\_Market\_80-40



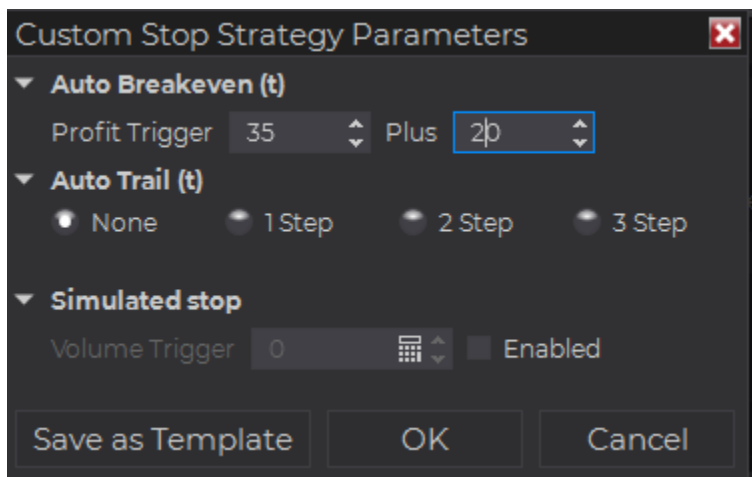
### Trailing Stop Addition:

- Click “More...” > Add Stop Strategy



- Name it: Breakeven
- Set:
  - **Profit Trigger:** 35 ticks
  - **Plus:** 20 ticks
  - **Stop Loss Adjustment:** 5 ticks

✓ This setting locks in 5 ticks once you’re 35+ ticks in profit — keeping your trailing buffer intact.



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### Example 2: Calm Market ATM Strategy

- **Order Quantity:** 2 MES
- **Stop Loss:** 20 ticks
- **Profit Target:** 40 ticks
- **Strategy Name:** Calm\_Market\_40-20

Trailing logic can be gentler:

- Profit Trigger: 20 ticks
- Plus: 10 ticks
- Adjusted Stop: Breakeven or small profit
